Wednesday, May 18th, 1988 at 7:30 p.m. Divinity College - Recreation Room

 In the absence of the President Bill MacPherson, Don Shepherd, the Vice-President welcomed about 50 members and their spouses. This was an increase in the number in attendance at last year's meeting.
