I Welcome

The Chairman, J. Evans extended a warm welcome to those present and commented that the Association is now entering its second decade.

II Minutes of the 1995 Annual General Meeting - May 17, 1995

III President's Report

The Chair reported that the Association had experienced a successful year as a result of a team effort. This was accomplished by means of Portfolios, whereby each member of Council assumed responsibility for a specific area of Council activities. Portfolios were identified as follows:

The Chair, on behalf of the Association thanked Bill McMicking and Joan Wiley, who are retiring from Council, for their support and valued assistance during their time on Council.

While the Chair had reported on matters pertaining to and affecting retirees, throughout year in MURAL, the following highlights were brought to the attention of members:

(a) the new term had commenced with an 'up-beat' meeting with the new President of the University, Peter George

- (b) the Benefits Committee had not met, but M. Maggs will report further on this and other matters at today's meeting.
- (c) at present a Faculty Benefits Review exercise is underway and the Chair has been consulted by the President of the Faculty Association for input.
- (d) the Staff Association negotiated agreement included a suggestion to split the Staff and Faculty benefits program, which suggestion had been turned down. Staff remuneration proposals will probably be going to mediation.
- (e) the Pension Trust Committee had devised a new method for calculating pension inflation adjustments largely through the efforts of Gerry King, MURA's representative to this committee. The Pension Ad Hoc Working Group had agreed upon revised Terms of Reference and membership for the Pension Trust Committee which will include voting privileges for MURA for the first time. This proposal will be sent to the various associations for approval and then incorporated into the By-laws of the Board, perhaps as early as the fall of 1996.
- (f) Early in 1996 the McMaster University Future Fund Committee (MUFF) was formed with the Chair representing MURA. The MUFF agreement has been signed off by the associatons and will be sent to the Board of Governors, which ultimately means that MURA will have voting rights on the MUFF management committee.
- the Chair expressed concern over some negative pension (g) developments, noting the MUSSA agreement not endorsed by the Support Staff included a proposal to split the pension plan in The pension plan could be changed to a defined Staff contribution or hybrid plan in future but this proposal has not as yet been approved. For present retirees there will be change in the plan because of the agreement to pay what we retirees have earned. It is however essential that MURA ensures that a fair share of the Pension Plan surplus accrues to Retirees in the event of a "wind- up" of the Defined Benefit Plan in order fund future inflation costs. The Chair stressed the importance of forming "alliances" with various campus groups to guarantee that retirees receive a fair share of any surplus.

IV Treasurer's Report

D. Haisell distributed copies of the Treasurer's Report to all members, which report showed a bank balance of \$3,275.25 as of April 30, 1996 with two term deposits held by the McMaster Savings and Credit Union which will mature in 1997, plus Petty Cash on hand of \$35.36.

V Pension Trust Committee

Gerry King, MURA's representative on this Committee, circulated his report (copy attached to master minutes) of this group to members present in which he reported that retirees would receive a 1.9% inflation increase in pensions effective 1 July, 1996. Gerry expressed a debt of gratitude on behalf of the Association to Jack Evans for his efforts in obtaining voting privileges for MURA. At the conclusion of Gerry's report, the Chair obtained the unanimous agreement of the meeting to Gerry's reappointment as our representative to the Pension Trust Committee.

VI Trips and Events

J. Baby circulated a copy of the Special Events and Financial Statement report to those present. It was noted that the bank balance should read \$1,186.61 instead of \$11,186.61.

VII Benefits Review Committee

M. Maggs reported that the Benefits Committee had not as yet met, which was of some concern to her. Margaret had, however, spoken to Bob Tangney of Human Resources regarding Bill 26, which was originally scheduled to be fully implemented in June of 1966 but has now been put back to August. Guidelines will be issued earlier in the summer by the government. Bob was of the opinion that drug costs would continue to be covered by the University, but nothing definite has been forthcoming. The use of generic drugs which are less expensive than some prescription drugs, will be a factor to be considered and approved by the patient's Physician.

Margaret advised that two minor items might be of interest to MURA members:

- (i) Vision Discount card details on this card are available in the Department of Human Resources
- (ii) An insurance program with Johnson Auto and Housing Company, for which details are available through Canada Trust.

VIII Membership

C. McMullen announced a MURA membership of 1,032 as compared to 984 at this time in 1995. It is hoped that this figure would increase to 1100 within the next year. Carm explained that Active membeship applies to those who have paid the \$10 annual fee, for which they receive all copies of the MURAL publication and are eligible to vote and hold office in the Association. He pointed out that a large Active membership is influential in dealings with the University. A suggestion was made from the floor that two prices for trips could be initiated whereby Active members were charged a set price and non-Active members charged a higher price. One other member suggested that trips could be limited only to Active members.

All new retirees will receive a letter from the Chairman inviting them to join MURA with information outlining the benefits of Active membership.

The Chair announced that \$100 had been sent by the Association to the annual Telethon in memory of Charlie Cook and Bill MacPherson.

IX Constitution Amendment

The Chair stated that Section 8.02 - Nominating Committee reads, "The Nominating Committee shall consist of the President of the Association who shall act as Chairman" It was the decision of Council that since everyone on Council serves two terms, the Past President should Chair the Nominating Committee.
