McMASTER UNIVERSITY RETIREES' ASSOCIATION

Minutes of the 15th Annual General Meeting held on Wednesday, May 24, 2000, at 3pm, in the Eleanor McKay Room, Moulton Hall.

1. WELCOME

John McCutcheon, Past-President, welcomed the 55 members and guests and especially Dr Bourns, Honorary President, Bob Tangney from Human Resources, and Karen Belaire, the new Vice-President Adminstration.

2. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS AGM

Motion: that the minutes of the 14th annual general meeting held on May 26, 1999 be adopted (Brian White/Eleanor Ecclestone CARRIED)

3. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In the absence of Gerry Keech, John McCutcheon gave the following report.

"President Gerry sends both his greetings and regrets that he cannot be with us this afternoon. He is at home recuperating from very successful heart surgery. I spoke to him on Monday and he sounded in excellent spirits. He even fleetingly thought of coming to the meeting, but discretion won the day.

Vice-President Veronica's husband is also back home recovering from major surgery. While Veronica really wanted to be here as chair of this meeting, her husband Jack still requires considerable care and assistance. I am sure both Gerry and Veronica will be back soon working as hard as ever for the Association.

Last year I announced that our long-time and dedicated Secretary, Dorothy Matheson, had to retire for health reasons. I am now saddened to announce that Dorothy passed away in March of this year.

As well as another year of successful social events and trips under the able leadership of Joy Baby, your Association leadership has continued to represent the interests of retirees on several University committees. Two major areas of input were the Pension Trust Committee with Gerry King as our voting representative, and the Retirement Provisions for Salaried Employees (including retirees) with Jack Evans as our able representative. The activities of both committees will be reviewed later in the agenda.

As the focus on protection of retirees' rights and benefits increases, the need for financial support of our Association also increases. Keeping our entire membership informed is all important, but the cost of printing and

mailing is high. So please, made sure you send us your \$10 donation each year, and encourage other retiree friends to do the same.

4. TREASURER'S REPORT

Dora Haisell presented her Financial Statement for the period. May 1, 1999 to May 4, 2000, which had been distributed at the meeting.

Motion: that the Treasurer's Report be adopted as printed (Dora Haisell/Joy Baby CARRIED)

5. AUDITOR'S REPORT

In the absence of the auditor, John McCutcheon presented the following report from Warren Mousley:

"I have examined the statement of receipts, disbursements and financial position of the McMaster University Retirees' Association for the year ending April 30, 2000. Receipts as shown in the accompanying statement is the amount reflected in the records of the Association but has not been verified by myself.

In my opinion the accompanying statement of receipts, disbursements and financial position present fairly the results of activities of the Association for the year ended April 30, 2000 and its assets as of that date."

Motion: that the Auditor's Report be received (Jack Evans/Brian White CARRIED)

6. PENSION TRUST COMMITTEE REPORT

Frank Drieman read Gerry King's report, which indicated that the fund is in good shape. The pension increase effective on July 1 this year will he 1.74%. The full text of the report will be published in the MURAL.

Motion: that the Pension Trust Committee Report be received (Frank Drieman/ Eleanor Ecclestone CARRIED)

7. REPORT ON RETIREMENT PROVISIONS FOR SALARIED EMPLOYEES

Jack Evans made it clear that his report dealt with the excess surplus in the pension plan for salaried employees (not hourly rated employees). He then read the following report:

"Much of what I have to report has already been communicated to all retirees in the November/December 1999 and the March/April editions of MURAL. My report today will cover the events subsequent to the last of these reports. But first, two matters of definition:

- Excess surplus is the surplus over and above that level of plan surplus required to be kept in the pension plan under Revenue Canada regulations.

- The excess surplus under consideration is that

surplus existing in the <u>Pension Plan for Salaried Employees</u>. Retirees receiving their pension from other plans (e.g. a plan for a bargaining unit) are

not covered in these discussions).

And now for the update. There have been no meetings since I last wrote to you in MURAL. The planned meeting of March 22, 2000 was not held. The new VP Administration has replaced the retired VP Administration. There have been some meetings of the experts (lawyers, actuaries, tax advisors) during which it appeared that the University was trying to re-define what a 50/50 sharing of the excess surplus meant. We have let our "experts" know (that) we shall vigorously oppose any such attempt." There were comments and questions concerning the 50/50 split and the need for University action on proposals to facilitate a fair and equitable disposition of the excess pension surplu/s, Karen Belaire listened carefully and said that this matter was high on her priority list.

The report was received.

8. BENEFITS REVIEW 1999-2000

Margaret Maggs gave the following report:

"This year was relatively quiet on the benefits front. However, two issues which we worked on during 1998-1999 came to a conclusion over the summer of 1999:

Parking Group Benefits

It was agreed that retirees in the Parking Group were entitled to the same benefit options as were offered in 1998 to the other non-union groups. Option packages were mailed to the group in the summer of 1999.

Ivor Wynne Centre Fee

The fee for using the Ivor Wynne Centre, which was levied on retirees, was revoked for those who retired prior to 1999. These retirees had been given free access to the Centre as a stated retirement benefit. This was an important recognition by the University Administration that benefits in place at the time of an employee's retirement should not subsequently be withdrawn.

Miscellaneous - Various problems regarding forms, T4

slips and parking were resolved.

Changes in Benefits for Non-teaching Staff in Plan 4 Human Resources have told us that there have been some changes in Plan 4. These are:

Prescription allowance raised from \$5 to \$6.50 Vision Care allowance raised from \$150 to \$175 Maximum for services of Licensed Practitioners (has been raised) from \$225 to \$300. I should note that OHIP has reduced the number of chiropractor visits for which it will pay. The University is not going to pick up this shortfall.

Retirees in the Non-teaching Staff Group will be informed

of these changes and their choice of benefit plan confirmed. Choice of benefit plan for other groups - Teaching staff and Librarians - will be confirmed when pressure of work-allows, hopefully later this year. Thanks

Finally, I would note that various members of Council field benefits questions and problems and thanks are due to them. Thanks are also due to Marion Grant-Hose and Bob Tangney in Human Resources, who courteously deal with our queries."

Questions were asked about group rate for travel insurance and access to information relevant to retirees through E-mail, similar to the service given to faculty. MURA Council will look into these matters.

However, since no resolution has yet taken place the MUFF Committee is meeting in June to consider grant proposals for 1999-2000.

12. NOMINATING COMMITTEE

John McCutcheon presented the report and then asked for any nominations from the floor. There were none but, as there were five nominations for four three-year term positions, a secret ballot was conducted. Please see attached list of MURA Executive and Council for 2000/2001.

Motion: that the Nominating Committee Report be approved.
