Minutes of the Council Meeting held on Wednesday **October 14, 1998**

1. Minutes of the Previous Meeting

2. Business arising from the Minutes

John McCutcheon reported that the September 16 meeting on benefits with representatives of Human Resources had gone quite well. A further meeting is scheduled for Thursday October 15, as much work remains to be done in drafting a clear information package indicating benefit options available to retirees.

3. President's Report

a) John McCutcheon, Jack Evans and Gerry Keech had met with the University President, Dr. Peter George for about half an hour. It was a semi-social occasion, part of the MURA tradition of keeping in touch with the President at least on an annual basis.

b) John McCutcheon reported that Dorothy Matheson is making progress and is hoping to be transferred soon from MUMC to Chedoke Hospital for rehabilitative treatment.

c) Copies of the McMaster University Futures Fund Report September 29, 1998, were distributed to Council members. The report covers recommendations in the following four areas: Conference Support (now extended to staff) \$100,000, Skills for the next Millenium \$200,000, Campus for the next Millenium \$200,000 and McMaster Fair \$15,000.

4. Financial Matters

a) Dora Haisell presented the financial report for September 1998.

- b) John McCutcheon plans to contact Warren Mousley on October 15 to invite him to become one of two auditors for the MUSA accounts.

5. Portfolio Reports

- a) Visitations etc - Jack Mass had sent sympathy cards to the widows of Gerald Boudreau, Earle Hampel and Randolph Ross.
- b) Events - The Canterbury Hills dinner and talk had been very successful. Joy Baby asked whether refunds should be given to three "no shows". The consensus was that money should not be refunded for this event. Some information for retirees regarding cancellation and refund guidelines would be helpful down the road.
- c) Benefits - Margaret Maggs stressed the complexity of the benefits information and the importance of clarifying various points with Bob Tangney and Marion Grant-Hose prior to mailing. She also made the general point that, as a matter of courtesy, Human Resources should provide the MURA President with a copy of any letter/package sent to all retirees.
- d) Courier / Mural - No Courier news. Planned mailing date for the next MURAL is Monday November 2 (Since the meeting Togo Salmon Hall Room 122 has been booked.)
- e) Membership - Gerry will provide a list of recent retirees for publication in the next MURAL.
- f) Christmas Lunch, December 7 - Brian has arrangements well in hand. One bottle of wine left over from Canterbury Hills dinner will be moved from the filing cabinet to await new life as a prize at the party.
- g) AGM / BBQ The President's House and the Eleanor McKay Room in Moulton Hall have been booked for Wednesday, May 26, 1999.
- h) Pension Matters - Jack Evans reported that he had attended the first meeting of the committee reviewing retirement provisions for salaried employees. More meetings are due to follow at frequent intervals.

John McCutcheon announced that the MURA Council meetings scheduled for January 13 and May 12, 1999 at 1.30 pm will be held in the John Hodgins Engineering Building room 265.
