

The big news on April 10th, for example, was the appointment of McMaster graduate and leading Canadian businesswoman Suzanne Labarge as the University's next Chancellor. Labarge will assume her three-year role as Chancellor on September 1st, 2013 succeeding Red Wilson, who has held the position for the past six years.

DONATING YOUR BODY FOR MEDICAL EDUCATION

Have you ever considered donating your body for use in training future medical professionals? When MURA Council member Lorraine Allan died last December, she did just that, bequeathing her body to the McMaster University Education Program in Anatomy.

The Anatomy Program's web site

(<http://fhs.mcmaster.ca/anatomy/bequeathals.html>) addresses a number of questions about their bequeathal program. You can contact them by telephone at 905-525-9140 ext. 22273 for more information. You may also want to visit the Government of Ontario web site on whole body donation.²

If you are interested in pursuing this further, you should know that:

- There is no age restriction for body donation.
- Illnesses and cause of death largely determine who may actually be accepted. For example, autopsy, recent trauma or surgery, certain infectious diseases, or extreme emaciation make a body ineligible for donation. Large individuals, i.e. those taller than 6'3" (196cm) or weighing more than 190 lbs (85 kg), are not eligible. The suitability for acceptance will be determined as soon as possible after the time of death.
- If a person wishes his/her body to be bequeathed to a School of Anatomy, only the eyes can be donated as a tissue gift for transplant³. If you donate other organs or tissue for transplant, you will not be eligible for whole body donation.
- Anatomical study and/or research in the Education Program in Anatomy is usually completed within five years after receiving a body. The cremated remains are then interred in the McMaster University crypt at Bayview Cemetery & Crematory in Burlington, Ontario. The remains of each donor are kept separate and identifiable. All expenses for cremation and interment in the McMaster University crypt are paid for by the Education Program in Anatomy. Within a year of the donation, the donor will be recognized at a Service of Gratitude.

Human Stem Cells: Biology and Applications Towards the Clinic

Dr. Mick Bhatia, Director and Senior Scientist, McMaster Stem Cell and Cancer Research Institute; Professor, Department of Biochemistry and Biomedical Sciences; associate member, Department of Pathology and Molecular Medicine.

Dr. Bhatia is a recognized leader in human stem cell biology and applications. Human stem cells provide the potential to model disease and regenerate organs.

Dr. Bhatia's research program uses human stem cells to understand how cancer begins and how treatment may be revolutionized based on this new knowledge.



At the MURA AGM, Dr. Bhatia will discuss progress in the area, limitations, and future directions toward the clinical reality of stem cell applications.


COMPLIMENTARY PARKING FOR THE AGM

MURA thanks Parking Services for this generous support

Retirees will have access to Parking Lots C, D and E, all close to Kenneth Taylor Hall. Come on campus via the Sterling Street entrance. Lot G - the underground Stadium lot - may also be used if the lots closer to KTH are full.

Retirees who do not have a McMaster parking permit and transponder may park in any of these lots showing "Visitors - Open". Take an entry ticket from the machine as you enter. Then be sure to pick up an "Exit Ticket" from the check-in table at the AGM location. Insert the Exit Ticket at the exit gate to "pay" for your parking when you leave your parking lot.

Retirees with valid transponders may park in any lot that shows "Transponders - Open".



For the mobility impaired, if you have an Ontario Accessible Parking Permit and require reserved accessible parking, please be sure to tell Janice in your RSVP. Reserved parking will be provided in Lot C close to the ramped entrance to the DeGroote School of Business. Use the elevator just inside the DeGroote building to access Celebration Hall in the Kenneth Taylor Hall basement. Parking staff will be on duty to assist with accessible parking in Lot C. Please have your Ontario Accessible Parking Permit on display in your vehicle.




Along with several other MURA members, Harold appears in twice-yearly musical variety shows mounted by the Follies. 

C. Barber Mueller, Professor Emeritus and founding Chairman of the Department of Surgery at McMaster, has been in touch to tell us about his book *EXCALIBUR, The Sword of Science That Reshaped the World*, which was published by Baxter Publishing Inc in November 2012.

This book brings an overview of ideas generated during the Age of Science, ideas that have forever changed our perceptions of the universe and of man's place on Earth. The past 400 years have seen the keen blade of the sword of science carve out a redefined world. As a scholar, thinker, surgeon and now a nonagenarian, Dr. Mueller explores the development of science as a cultural phenomenon that began in a climate of opposition and now dominates many features of our daily lives.

Assess Your Risk for Heart Disease & Stroke

The Heart & Stroke Foundation web site (<https://makehealthlast.ca/>) has some useful guidance on living a longer and healthier life.

The site includes an-easy-to-use tool for assessing your risk of heart disease and stroke. The assessment will ask you questions ranging from your family health history to your eating habits and stress levels. It is confidential, free and takes less than 10 minutes to complete. You can either register with the Heart & Stroke Foundation by providing your name and email address or take the assessment anonymously by clicking this option at the bottom of the sign-in page.

Once you complete the Risk Assessment, you will be provided with a personalized summary report and receive a recommendation on what you can do to improve your health.


